### KEY IDEAS

1. Philanthropy is a series of hard questions. Research raises issues, guiding people to give as they otherwise wouldn't.
2. For practitioners, research helps to unearth assumptions about how we work. What knowledge is used & why; integrating reflection into the everyday.
3. We need to deconstruct the default stereotype of who is a philanthropist. It is not just white, US, billionaires, we exclude many experiences this way.
